1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 The purpose of this report is to seek Committee approval for the name of the new South of the City Academy which will replace Kincorth Academy and Torry Academy.

2. RECOMMENDATION(S)

2.1 It is recommended that Committee agree:

- To note the engagement with pupils, staff and wider community to find a name for the new South of the City Academy and the scores registered for each shortlisted name;
- (ii) Agree that following the public consultation the Academy be called Lochside Academy; and
- (iii) Otherwise note the content of this report.

3. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 3.1 Financial Close for the new Lochside Academy was achieved on 30 June 2016. The total capital cost of construction was agreed at £46.9 million.
- 3.2 There are no implications arising from the naming process.

4 OTHER IMPLICATIONS

4.1 Nil.

5. BACKGROUND/MAIN ISSUES

- 5.1 Prior to the end of the summer term each of the schools in the Kincorth Academy and Torry Academy Associated School Groups (ASGs) were asked to provide a list of potential names for the new Academy, with the closing date being the end of August 2016.
- 5.2 Of the names submitted by schools, there were 5 entries that each had numerous submissions. These were as follows:
 - Wellington Academy;
 - Calder Academy;
 - Redmoss Academy;
 - Lochside Academy; and
 - Altens Academy.
- 5.3 Following the pupil's return from the October break a two week opportunity was given for pupils, staff, parents and the wider community to vote for their favourite choice of name. Letters were sent to all parents, the Parent Councils of each school in the 2 ASGs and the 4 Community Councils. Schools ran referenda and the public were able to vote online.
- 5.4 The number of votes for each of the 5 names are shown in the table (below).

5.5 It is therefore proposed that the new Academy is called Lochside Academy.

6. IMPACT

6.1 **Improving Customer Experience / Improving Staff Experience** Lochside Academy will provide pupils and staff with the opportunity to undertake learning and teaching in a modern, flexible environment which has been built to deliver the Curriculum for Excellence. Outside of the school day the building will become a leisure hub and will allow the community to access a range of sporting and leisure facilities.

6.2 Improving our use of Resources

The new Academy will reduce the Council's secondary estate by 1 school and with the building being constructed with modern technology it will improve the energy efficiency of the exiting 2 school buildings, reducing the Council's carbon footprint.

6.3 Corporate

The delivery of Lochside Academy meets the corporate aims of Aberdeen – the Smarter City.
