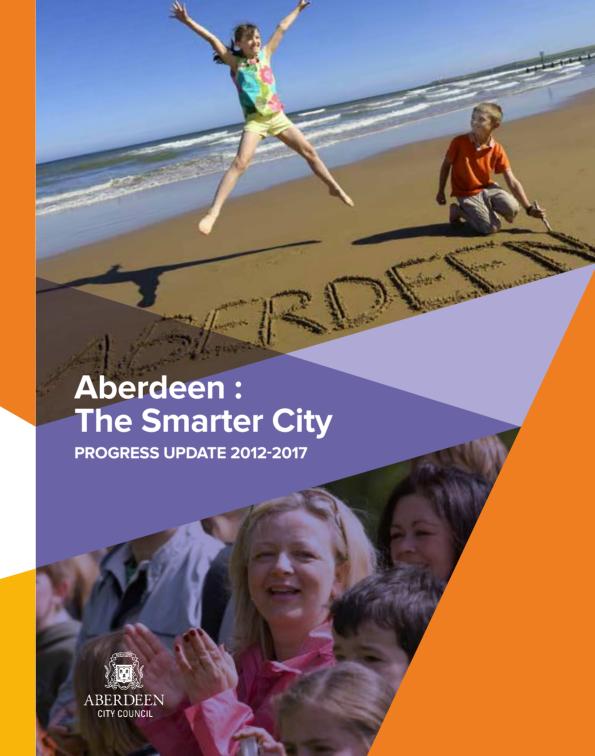

In 2012 Aberdeen City Council adopted a five year programme under the overarching theme of the Smarter City.

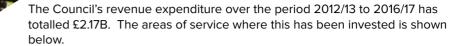
The programme for a Smarter City was broken down into individual strands with a focus on people, the environment, the economy, mobility, living and governance.

A number of high level priorities were set with the overall aim of creating a better place to serve the people and businesses of Aberdeen and their future needs

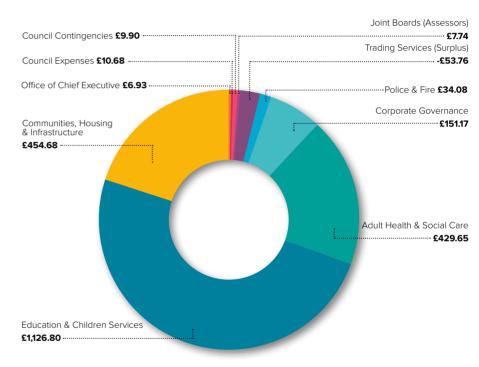
