I refer to your letter of 22 August which relates to the above Application.

I should like to register my objection to the proposed change in the commencement time for the sale of alcohol on Sundays from 12.30 to 11.00.

My property borders the Ferryhill House Hotel grounds. For years now, and *with no objection from me*, my Sundays have been disturbed by the screaming – and I do mean screaming – of children playing in the area set aside for them just across my wall in the grounds of the hotel, while the accompanying adults are having a drink – in an area set well away from this playground - and paying attention neither to the children nor to the noise they make. In no way do I wish to be a party-pooper, but I do feel that an extension by one and a half hours of this situation on a Sunday is not tolerable. Sunday is supposed to be a day of rest!

Further, I must ask whether there is a need to extend the licensing hours at all. Surely 12.30 on a Sunday is a perfectly reasonable time for the sale of alcohol to commence.

LA BAMBA, 23 CROWN TERRACE, ABERDEEN, AB11 6HD**

I refer to the above application for the variation of a premises licence under terms of Section 29(5) of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005.

The variation requested consists of:

- An amendment to the terminal hour for on sales on Friday and Saturdays to 0300 hours
- The completion of section 5(g) of the Operation Plan in respect of Late Opening Premises.
- Various alterations to the layout plan

In terms of Section 29(5) of the Act this request can be considered a variation.

In terms of Section 22(1)(b)(ii) and (iii) of the same Act, I make the following representation on behalf of the Chief Constable.

The applicant currently holds a premises licence allowing the sale of alcohol between 1200 and 0100 hours Mondays to Sundays inclusive. The variation requests an amendment to the terminal hour from 0100 to 0300 hours on Fridays and Saturdays and Sundays.

If the hours applied for were granted this would result in 15 hours of continuous trading on Fridays and Saturdays which is outwith the guidelines of 14 hours as contained within the Aberdeen City Licensing Board Statement of Licensing Policy. The Chief Constable is of the opinion that, if granted, this would set a precedent which other premises, who trade for 14 continuous hours, would be likely to follow.

Grampian Police have carried out a visit to the premises and spoken with Steven Janssen, the Designated Premises Manager, who advised that at present no food is served in the restaurant after 2200 hours. If granted, the extended hours are intended to cater for customers who want to drink alcohol and dance later than 0100 hours, but who do not want to go to other premises in the city centre. Mr Janssen also advised that at present their intention is that only customers already within the premises for the consumption of a meal would be able to take advantage of the longer opening hours and that members of the public who had not dined there would not be admitted solely for the purpose of consuming alcohol.

The amended Operating Plan at 5(g) states that the recorded music on offer will not exceed 85db and that when fully occupied there will not be more customers standing than seated. When asked what the decibel level would be Mr Janssen was unable to answer nor could he advise how the existing decibel level was measured. However, on the basis of the information provided within the amended Operating Plan it appears that if the variation is granted the premises would not be subject to The Licensing Conditions (Late Opening Premises) (Scotland) Regulations 2007.

In terms of Section 22(1)(b)(ii) and (iii) of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005, the Chief Constable is of the opinion that the variation in its current form should be modified so that the total continuous hours of trading on Fridays and Saturdays do not exceed 14 hours.

The Chief Constable has no adverse comment to make regarding the proposed alterations to the layout plan.

This representation is submitted for your attention in considering this application.

### **Metro Lodge Limited t/a Bauhaus Hotel, 56-60 Langstane Place, Aberdeen Application for Variation of Premises Licence, La Tasca, 367 Union Street, Aberdeen AB11 6BT**

We act for Metro Lodge Limited who trade as Bauhaus Hotel, 56-60 Langstane Place, Aberdeen who have received details of an application to vary the premises licence at La Tasca, 367 Union Street, Aberdeen AB11 6BT.

In essence, the variation is to change the operating plan (1) to include dance classes, (2) to show televised sport in the bar and (3) to provide wine tastings for diners.

We should explain that our clients' premises are at the rear of the premises occupied by La Tasca in Union Street and in areas overlap them, in particular the back corridor in the hotel where rooms 207/215 are situated directly above the La Tasca premises.

Since La Tasca commenced salsa dancing classes, our clients have on several occasions had to complain to La Tasca management because of noise emanating from their premises later on in the evening. The manager of Bauhaus Hotel, Sylvia Beaton and her two other duty managers, met with very little cooperation from the management of La Tasca when requesting them to turn down or off the music. The La Tasca staff were often rude on the phone and even on occasions told our clients' management that they could not hear what they were saying because of the noise!

Because of that, our clients formally complained to Environmental Health who recommended that they keep a list detailing the occasions when there was a problem

with noise. We enclose a copy of the list which details the worst incidents although there have been other incidences of noise that have not been so disruptive.

The Licensing Board may well recall that because of one incident relating to noise emanating from the top floor conference room, the premises licence for the hotel was granted with a local condition that activities undertaken within the conference room must not include amplified music after 2300 nor DJs at any time.

With regard to this application for variation, our clients, Metro Lodge Limited would wish to make the following objection/representation.

Whilst they have no problem in general with the changes to the operating plan numbers 1, 2 and 3 as above stated, they would wish those activities only to occur if they did not cause any inconvenience or upset to residents of the hotel. There have been several complaints from residents about the noise coming from the salsa dancing classes at La Tasca which has necessitated residents being moved to different rooms. The worst affected rooms, as we stated, are rooms numbered 207-215. Our clients believe that the salsa dance classes started early in 2011 perhaps in January with a series of classes which were then discontinued. Recently, the classes seem to have restarted as the noise complaints have begun to reoccur.

Guests at the hotel tend to retire to bed around 10pm which is normally when the noise complaints to La Tasca commence. Our clients would wish La Tasca to hold the dance classes in such a way to minimise the noise impact on residents of The Bauhaus Hotel, in particular, our clients would consider it appropriate for the Board to impose a local condition on their licence that dance classes should cease at 10pm. They believe that to be a fair compromise.

On a different but associated matter, our clients continue to complain to La Tasca about the state of their refuse bins which are left outside the rear of their premises on Langstane Place next to the hotel. The bins are left outside and not taken in which our clients consider to be in breach of environmental health and perhaps planning and licensing requirements. The bins are filthy and never cleaned. One bin in particular has no lid. Seagulls daily remove rubbish from the bin creating a litter hazard in the area and in particular outside the hotel. Again, our clients have complained to La Tasca management in the past but the nuisance continues. We trust that La Tasca will be prepared to give undertakings to the Board as to resolve this issue as well.

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We would be grateful if you could acknowledge safe receipt of this letter and that it will be placed before the Licensing Board of 18 October 2011 when the application will be considered.
