I am hereby writing to object to the planned application to change the layout of Bad Apple, 2 Justice Mill Lane, Aberdeen AB11 6EP. As a stakeholder of property 12B Bon Accord Terrace, Aberdeen, AB11 6DP, the application would result in several issues;

Firstly, my bedroom looks out on the back of Bad Apple, which is where the intended roof terrace is to be built. The noise level is bad enough at the moment due to staff taking their breaks outside the rear fire door, the throwing of bottles into the bottle bin, the outdoor smoking area, and people leaving the club at unsociable hours. If a roof terrace was built the noise level would increase to unacceptable levels with people constantly outside meaning that all residents in our block of flats plus surrounding business would be affected. I would also object as the clientele that have been in the nightclub since it has opened is less than favourable and so would not relish the prospect of having to listen to them for extended periods of time into the early hours of the morning. In a recent incident someone was pushed down the stairs at the front of the club resulting in two police vans and an ambulance having to attend, not to mention a crowd of 50 plus onlookers, if this had been from a roof terrace the results could have been tragic.

The proposed roof terrace would severely impede our privacy, as curtains would need to be drawn at all times so the general public could were not looking directly into our flat and the numerous others in the building. I see no reason for the roof terrace as Bad Apple already has an outside smoking area and it isn't open during the day where people could sit outside during the summer months (in fact the vast majority of the time weather conditions would mean it gets no use at all!). Bad Apple's sister bar Amicus Apple is across the road where there is room to sit outside. If this does go ahead my partner and I will be moving out, as I am sure will several of the tenants in our block, the effect on the owners of the flat would be far worse as it would undoubtedly reduce the value of the properties and would hinder their chances of being able to let the flats.

The Variation Application and operating plan indicate that the applicant proposes to internally alter the premises removing the bar at ground floor level and replacing this with a seating and dancing area. To reduce transfer of noise from this area from customers entering and existing the premises the applicant proposes to install double vestibule doors.

To discourage customers from congregating on the street to smoke and reduce the noise impact from this practice the applicant proposes to create an external terrace on the first floor at the Bon-accord Terrace side of the property. The external terrace would be utilised by smokers and customers eating and drinking. To reduce the potential for noise nuisance the applicant proposes to install an 8ft. screen at the front of the terrace area.

With the aforementioned in mind and whilst not objecting I would ask that if granted that conditions be attached regarding the use of the external terrace area to include.

- 1) no amplified music.
- 2) That no awning or patio heater be installed to encourage customers to remain within the area later in the evening.
- 3) I would recommend that the use of the area be restricted to 10 pm.

The application also includes access for children and young persons within the bar area till 8pm, however, it does not appear to have a restriction within the restaurant or outside area which would if this application appear to allow children access till 2am and 3am respectively, if this was the case i would have concerns regarding Children's access at these late hours.

With regards to the use of the Outside area in the early hours of the morning by customers again I have concerns, as this service has previously had noise complaints about loud music from the use of the open courtyard (albeit not from this current premises) and as the balcony area forms part of the courtyard I have concerns that the complaints may manifest themselves once again.

With the aforementioned in mind I could not support the application in its current form.

I refer to the above application for the variation of a premises licence under terms of Section 29(5) of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005.

The variation requested consists of removing from the current licensed area, the section of pavement directly adjacent to the premises and inclusion of a section of walled garden area to the rear of the premises. As an external area both food and beverages, both alcoholic and none alcoholic will be served. The external seating area is proposed to have terminal hours until 2300 hours Monday to Sunday inclusive.

In terms of Section 29(5) of the Act this request can be considered a variation.

In terms of Section 22(1)(b)(ii) and (iii) of the same Act, I make the following representation on behalf of the Chief Constable.

I have concerns in relation to alcohol being served until 2300 hours Monday to Sunday inclusive. The premises are in a highly populated residential area and by agreeing to the proposed terminal hours it would create an environment of noise pollution which would affect the surrounding area. This is also aggravated by the 30 minute drinking up time for premises when alcohol is taken with a meal and would result in persons being outside the premises drinking until 2330 hours.

In terms of Section 22(1)(b)(ii) and (iii) of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005, the Chief Constable is of the opinion that the variation in its current form should be modified so that the terminal hour for the outside seating area is 2100 hours, and with the 30 minute drinking up time would extend the terminal hour to 2130 hours, in order that the premises minimise the potential of breaching the Prevent Public Nuisance objective.

This representation is submitted for your attention in considering this application.

I refer to the above and comment as follows.

The Variation Application and operating plan indicate that the premises wish to amend the area used for outside dining / smoking to an area which at present is also incorporates the route used for disabled access to the premises. The disabled access route would be retained. Within the variation application.

I would say that the description of where the new outside area is to be located is somewhat misleading as it is at the side or adjacent to the frontage rather than at the rear of the premises. The area in question also appears to locate the customers further away from the neighbouring dwellings on Forrest Avenue than is at presently permitted

With regards to the use of the Outside Area I have been in contact with the applicant and I have been assured that if granted the area would be cleared of some small bushes etc and that there would be no awning or patio heaters to encourage customers to stay outside , although it would create a more discreet area for smokers rather that have them outside the main door on the pavement adjacent to Union Grove / Forrest Avenue.

It is also noted that the use of the area would be till 23:00 hrs whilst the premises are open till midnight.

With the aforementioned in mind and whilst not objecting I would ask that if granted that conditions be attached regarding the use of the outdoor area to include.

- 1) no amplified music.
- 2) That no awning or patio heater be installed to encourage customers to remain within the area later in the evening.
- 3) I would recommend that the use of the area be restricted to 10pm.






As an occupant of a neighboring property I have to raise some concerns regarding this application:

I would like object to the proposal for the Nargile restaurant 106 forest Avenue for extending their license to include an additional 44 outdoor seated area.

I consider Forest Avenue primarily a residential area and at present the Nargiledoes impacts the street, often there is noise from patrons leaving the restaurant particularly when it closes at night. My daughter is a competitive swimmer and goes to bed early to get up at 5 AM to go swimming; quite often her sleep is broken with this noise in the street.

Although the street is controlled by parking meters there is insufficient parking in the in the evening when the Nargile is open and there is no control on parking, people even park on the zig zags for the pedestrian crossing.

At present also the delivery vans regularly pose a danger to pedestrians by parking on the zig zags or directly across the pedestrian crossing. I would therefore like to object to the proposal on the following grounds.

Taxis often stop outside and peep to alert the person that booked the taxi that it is there.

- 1. At present all noise from the Nargile restaurant is confined to the street side of the houses, now the nuisance noise will be transferred to the rear gardens of all the houses which include houses with young children.
- 2. This outdoor area will be suitable for smoking and people will be subject to passive smoking within their own gardens
- 3. There is insufficient parking at present for the patrons and resident this will just provide a further nuisance to the residents.
- 4. There will be an increase in noise at closing time due to more patrons frequenting the Nargile if this proposal.

I don't believe this will enhance or benefit the area it will only provide a further nuisance to the resident of a primarily residential area

I write to intimate my objection to this application.







- BACKGROUND/MAIN ISSUES
- 5.1 Section 349 (1) of the Act requires all licensing authorities to prepare and publish every three years a statement of the principles that they propose to apply in exercising their function under the Act during the three year period to which the policy applies.

The Licensing Authority Statement of Policy will last for a maximum of three years, but can be reviewed at any time. The Board's current policy runs from January 2010 to January 2013. Members are invited to view the policy on the Board's website at <a href="mailto:aberdeencity.gov.uk/law-licensing/licensi

The Policy requires to be reviewed, revised and published by 3 January 2013.

- 5.2 Section 349 (3) of the Act requires the licensing authority to consult with the following on the Statement of Policy or any subsequent revision:
 - Chief Constable

- One or more persons who appear to the authority to represent the interests of persons carrying on gambling businesses in the authority's area
- One or more persons who appear to the authority to represent the interests of persons who are likely to be affected by the exercise of the authority's function under this Act.

The Gambling Commission's Guidance to Licensing Authorities 3rd Edition suggests that licensing authorities may wish to consider consulting with a range of organisations including: faith groups, voluntary and community organisations working with children and young people, organisations working with people who are problem gamblers, medical practices or primary care trusts, and advocacy organisations, other tiers of local government, holders of gambling premises licences and responsible authorities named in the Act.

Officers will conduct a written consultation allowing 8 weeks for responses to it. The results of the consultation will thereafter be reported back to the Board for its consideration.
