Mrs O'Hare, Legal Advisor, advised that the applicant had now advised that the application in respect of the site at Moss Road, West Side, 160metres south of Gateway Drive, Aberdeen, had been withdrawn and therefore the application was solely for the site at Gateway Drive, Northern Spur, west side, 50metres north of roundabout. She also explained that the letter of representation from Total had been in respect of the site which had been withdrawn.
