Application for a public procession – Cove Gala

This is an application for a public procession order by Cove Gala. The procession is due to take place on 11 June 2016.

The application was received on 23 May 2016 however it is dated 23 February 2016. The applicant has advised that she liaised with a ward Member who she believed was progressing the application however it had not been received by the licensing section .

The applicant is required to give 28 days notice of its intention to hold a public procession. The Committee may waive such requirement in exceptional circumstances and following consultation with the Chief Constable.

The Chief Constable has been consulted and has no objection to the application. The applicant has also obtained a TTRO from the Roads department of Aberdeen City Council.

The Committee must therefore consider whether to waive the requirement to give notice and allow officers to grant the order.

Application for a public procession – Culter Gala

This is an application for a public procession order by Culter Gala. The procession is due to take place on 28 May 2016.

The application was received on 23 May 2016. The applicant is required to give 28 days notice of its intention to hold a public procession. The Committee may waive such requirement in exceptional circumstances and following consultation with the Chief Constable.

The Chief Constable has been consulted and has no objection to the application. The applicant has also obtained a TTRO from the Roads department of Aberdeen City Council.

The applicant has advised that due to a change of personnel there was a lack of awareness regarding the application process and the failure to give notice was due to an administrative oversight.

The Committee must therefore consider whether to waive the requirement to give notice and allow officers to grant the order.
