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The Lancet stated that "it is not implausible to

Justice, the United Nations' highest court, ruled			
that "Israel's continued presence in the Occupied			
Palestinian Territory is unlawful" and that Israel "is			
under an obligation to bring to an end its unlawful			
presence in the Occupied Palestinian Territory as			
rapidly as possible" and "is under an obligation to cease immediately all new settlement activities,			
and to evacuate all settlers from the Occupied			
Palestinian Territory".			
This Council reaffirms its place as part of the			
common family of humanity, and:
