LSO Report

BACKGROUND

Police Scotland wrote to the Licensing Board on 23 April 2025 making an application for a review of the premises licence.

Police Scotland advised that since November 2024, there have been six recorded incidents involving violence, disorder and staff drunkenness.

The Licensing Standards Officer has been provided with a copy of the Premises Licence Review Proposal and has provided a report in accordance with s 38(4) of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005. A copy of the report is attached.

The licence holder, Licensing Standards Officer and Police Scotland have been invited to attend the hearing.

BOARD'S POWERS ON REVIEW

(1) At a review hearing in relation to any premises licence, the Licensing Board may, if satisfied that a ground for review is established (whether or not on the basis of any circumstances alleged in the premises licence review proposal or application considered at the hearing) take such of the steps mentioned in subsection (2) as

the Board considers necessary or appropriate for the purposes of any of the licensing objectives.

- (1A) Subsection (1) is subject to subsection (2A).
- (2) Those steps are—
 - (a) to issue a written warning to the licence holder,
 - (b) to make a variation of the licence,
 - (c) to suspend the licence for such period as the Board may determine,
 - (d) to revoke the licence.
- (2A) Where, at a review hearing in relation to any premises licence, the Licensing Board are satisfied that the ground for review specified in section 36(3)(za) (that, having regard to the licensing objectives, the licence holder is not a fit and proper person to be the holder of a premises licence) is established, the Board must revoke the licence.
- (2B) Subject to <u>section 39B</u> (see below), a revocation under subsection (2A) takes effect at the end of the period of 28 days beginning with the day on which the Board makes the decision.
- (3) On making a variation under subsection (2)(b), the Board may provide for the variation to apply only for such period as they may determine.

39B Recall of revocation of licence under section 39(2A)

- (1) This section applies where a Licensing Board decides to revoke a premises licence under section 39(2A).
- (2) The Board must recall the revocation if—
 - (a) a relevant application is made before the end of the period referred to in section 39(2B) ("the 28 day period"), and
 - (b) the Board grants the application.
- (3) The Board may extend the 28 day period pending determination of a relevant application.
- (4) In this section, "relevant application" means—
 - (a) an application under section 33(1) for the transfer of the premises licence, or

- (b) a premises licence variation application seeking a variation of the licence that the Board considers would remove the ground on which the licence was revoked under <u>section 39(2A)</u>.
- (5) This section does not affect the right to appeal against the decision to revoke the licence under <u>section 39(2A)</u>.

POLICY

8. Supplementary Policy – Occasional Licences and Extended Hours

The holder of a Premises Licence may apply for an extension of regular licensed hours in connection with:

- A special event or occasion to be catered for on the premises, or
- A special event of local or national significance.

The Board expect licence holders to anticipate and incorporate recurring events into the Premises Licence and only to apply for Extended Hours for one-off events that could not have reasonably been anticipated. For the avoidance of doubt an Extended Hours application may extend a premises' trading hours beyond the 15-hour period specified in the Supplementary Policy on Licensed Hours on a one-off basis.

Any application must be submitted by the licence holder and not the Designated Premises Manager unless he or she has written authorisation from the licence holder to do so. Applications must be made at least 4 weeks in advance of the event.

- 2. In terms of Section 68(2) of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005, the duration applied for may not exceed a period of **one month**.

Please ensure that the 'from' and 'to' dates of the proposed duration reflect the days on which the **extension** should begin and end.

- (e.g. A Premises Licence allows a premises to trade until 01:00 and said premises lodges an extended hours application to trade until 02:00 in respect of a special event such as a Wedding Reception. I refer to the above premises and an application for extended hours to be granted from Sunday 13 July to Friday 18 July 2025 and also on Wednesday 23 July 2025.

The applicant currently holds a premises licence allowing the sale of alcohol between Sunday – Thursday 1000 – 0000 hours and Friday and Saturday 1000 – 0100 hours

The applicant has applied for a one hour extension, from 0000 hours to 0100 hours on Sunday 13th July to Friday 18th July 2025 and also Wednesday 23rd July 2025. This is to facilitate on sales consumption of alcohol at after festival events following the Tall Ships race in Aberdeen.

Section 68(1)(b) of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 allows applications for extended hours to be granted if the Licensing Board consider it appropriate to do so in connection with a special event or occasion to be catered for on the premises or a special event of local or national significance.

Section 70A(1) of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 provides that a Licensing Board can grant a variation of the conditions to which a licence is subject and that variation may have effect only in relation to the extended period of licensed hours.

OFFICIAL

In support of the licensing objectives of Preventing Crime and Disorder and Preventing Public Nuisance, I invite Aberdeen City Licensing Board to consider granting the application subject to a variation of the licence for the period of extended hours only, with the following conditions:

- 1. The licence holder or their nominee and sufficient responsible persons are to be present throughout the event to ensure its safe conduct and compliance with the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005.
- 2. A holder of a Personal Licence under the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 to be on duty for the period of extended hours.
- 3. SIA licensed door stewards are to be deployed for the period of extended hours.
- 4. No outdoor drinking areas to be used and no patrons to congregate immediately out with the premises during the period of extended hours, with the exception of those who have left the premises for the sole reason of complying with the Prohibition of Smoking in Certain Premises (Scotland) Regulations 2006).
- 5. The Duty of Care Policy condition as per the Board's Statement of Licensing Policy to be in place.
