UPDATE:

To provide elected members with a summary of results from investigations undertaken during 2018/2019 by the Corporate Investigation Team. Investigations fall into two categories; internal and external.

Internal: Staff Misconduct, Whistleblowing, Investigations undertaken on behalf of a Senior Service Manger

External: Where a service user or third party has claimed for a council service and failed to provide the proper documentation or failed to report a change of circumstances where they are required to do so.

During the year we recruited a fixed term contract Blue Badge and Parking Enforcement Officer which increased our operational costs. Our combined anti-fraud initiatives have still allowed us to maintain a positive investment return.

6. Summary

The refreshed Local Outcome Improvement plan gives a commitment to improve the City's economy and to deliver targeted interventions aimed at reducing specific offences and supporting people and families affected. The increased number of referrals being received is welcome and gives us the opportunity to reduce losses to the public purse at an early stage as well as allowing us to signpost those who are vulnerable or struggling financially towards other Council services instead of being managed by the criminal justice system.

A review of the team's priorities will be undertaken as part of the Governance Service Redesign to ensure investigation resources are being focused on high risk areas and administration tasks reduced as much as possible.

We continue to recognise the value of collaboration and the opportunity to share resources, skills and work across geographical boundaries is key to tackling fraud. This must be balanced against available resources and time however we will continue to seek every opportunity to do so.
