

Integrated Impact Assessment Pre-screening

Brief description of policy / proposal (including intended outcomes and purposes)	Background - We currently have a contract for a mailing tool - GovDelivery. The current annual costs are £21,887. Our current contract is due to end 24/06/22 and we are required to provide 90 days' notice period. We currently have 100,000 subscribers to our GovDelivery system who are signed up to receive bulletins to a range of topics that they select such as Events at the Art Gallery to Garden Waste Permit information. Our average open rate for these emails is 27%.							
	Proposal – To ensure best value, we propose to end our current contract with GovDelivery and will identify and implement alternative free mailing tools (such as GovNotify which is available to public sector organisations and has been used as part of the Council's response to self-isolating citizens) to continue to provide the service to customers.							
	Intended Outcomes and Purposes- There are National Standards for Community Engagement which have been designed to improve and guide the process of community engagement. As part of our Customer Transformation Programme of work we will undertake a review of our current engagement model and work with customers to identify challenges. We will use this insight to create a new vision for customer engagement and develop an Aberdeen City Council toolkit for consultation and reporting feedback to customers.

We are actively working with Community Planning Aberdeen specifically around improving how comfortable citizens feel using digital tools. We acknowledge that there are citizens with varying levels of literacy, digital literacy and English is not their first language so we will always work with the customer to ensure we can best meet their needs.

We know from local data and recent surveys that a high majority of citizens have access to a digital device. We are involved with many local groups supporting digital literacy initiatives to ensure no one is disadvantaged.
