

Integrated Impact Assessment Pre-screening

	Exploring the option to employ an occupational Nurse in-house to improve the service received and mirror other local authority provision to support resilience across authority boundaries could remove health surveillance items from the core OH contract. There may also be additional benefits in terms of timescales for starting new employees and support for reducing absence levels.								
	The contract with the current provider may require to be terminated, which has just been renegotiated and is a joint contract with Aberdeenshire and Moray.								
	Moving to an in-house occupational health service would lead to the potential for additional costs to be accrued in terms of buying in clinical supervision and physician support for ill health retirements and complex cases.
