No		Yes	<p>Mobile traders shall remain in the same place only for 20 minutes or the time it takes to serve the queueing customers, whichever is the later, and shall then move on. This condition is not applicable to general street traders.”</p> <p>I have a problem with the above condition you are trying to implement, I don't see any benefit from this, we comply to this rule within the shire and have no time restriction in the Aberdeen City Area, the shopping experience at the moment in Aberdeen City Centre is so much better as the customers are not rushed, the old people get time to choose and get time to ask for cooking instructions, allergens, we get people in wheelchairs who come to us too, I think this new condition is unnecessary and the existing system is much better than Aberdeenshire, we are currently trading within both different days of the week and talking from absolute experience, some stops we only stay 20 minutes but some stops are longer, it just depends on demand, I am strongly objecting to this. A good stop like Mastrick, a busy working class area, with no butcher, to reduce this to 20 minutes would deprive them of the current set up they have, it would also mean we would loose sales, in the current climate no business can afford to loose sales. We would be forced to travel more, use more fuel and obviously worse for the environment, I am very surprised Aberdeen city council are considering this due to the zero emissions you are hoping to produce in the city, we are happy to discuss this point further please call us on 01224 638525.</p>
