This 3.10 memo is to seek permission to extend the Framework Agreement for further a period of 7 months (23rd August 2022 – 31st March 2023). While the proposed spend has been approved, this was to be under a new DPS and not under an existing Framework Agreement. Due to the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic on the work of the Passenger Transport Unit and that work was being undertaken to progress a Dynamic Purchasing System (DPS), which is a new contracting requirement for the team, over a Framework Agreement, progress was delayed. This has however been further impacted due to a number of vacancies in the team, which has resulted in staff time being required to deliver key operational tasks and has limited time to progress the required works to implement a DPS. This has been further impacted on providing the required level of support for new starts and workload demands to support key Council Delivery projects, such as the City Centre Masterplan Multi-Modal Corridor Studies and unexpected Bus Service changes which has required significant officer input in managing comms, enquiries, complaints and assessments. The provision of a short-term arrangement will provide the Passenger Transport Unit the time to ensure day to day operations are fully covered and to then progress the required to be on the future DPS. In recent months they have experienced significant staff resourcing difficulties, largely as a result of the Covid-19 pandemic and the ongoing Nationwide Driver shortages this has required their management staff to be undertaking operational roles, which limits their ability to deal with large scale tender requirements. The provision of a short-term arrangement will provide potential future service providers with the time to recruit and return to a stable operation.
