#### 1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 This report provides the Committee with the results of the consultation on street trading activities at Aberdeen Beach.

#### 2. RECOMMENDATION(S)

That the Committee:

- 2.1 Considers the Consultation responses in Appendices 1 to 4; and
- 2.2 Agrees to continue to consider applications for street trading at the beachfront on a case-by-case basis;

### 3. CURRENT SITUATION

- 3.1 At the meeting of the Committee on 15 March 2023 officers were instructed to undertake a consultation exercise with respect to street trading activity at Aberdeen Beach.
- 3.2 A public consultation was held online between 28 March 2023 and 28 April 2023 and was advertised on the Council's social media channels.
- 3.3 A total of 4336 responses were received. A summary of the consultation is attached as Appendix 1 to this report.
- 3.4 Opinions were initially sought on whether or not there were issues with street trading activities in the beach area. The vast majority of responses (3843) indicated there were no issues. The reasons given are detailed in Appendix 2 to the report which can be accessed at <u>Appendix 2</u> <u>Street\_Trader\_Policy\_Consultation\_2023-question\_5\_responses\_V2.xls</u> (live.com)

3.5 Opinions were then sought on the most suitable options for street trading at the beach:

No restrictions	1960
Specific area of beachfront, no restriction on numbers	968
Restricted number of specific pitches	862
Restricted number, no restriction on area	300
Other	172
No street trading at beachfront	74

- 3.6 The main recurring themes within the responses appear to be that the street traders offer a welcome addition to the beachfront, create a community feel and attract footfall to the beach, whilst providing a variety of affordable options for customers and opportunities for small local businesses. Additionally, many people appear to consider supply and demand will regulate numbers.
- 3.7 The main themes for those opposing or concerned about street traders appear to be based on nuisance from litter and smells, issues with parking, and concerns over the aesthetics of some of the vehicles/kiosks and the impression that they are taking income from the cafes on the beachfront.
- 3.8 Any other comments were invited as a final question and the responses are detailed in Appendix 4 to the report which can be accessed at <u>Appendix 4</u> <u>Street\_Trader\_Policy\_Consultation\_2023-any\_other\_commentsV2.xls</u> (live.com)

The same themes identified at paragraphs 3.6 and 3.7 were largely repeated, with the vast majority of respondents viewing the street traders as a positive addition to the beachfront.
