
## **Climate Change Reporting**

2023/24 Summary Report and 3rd year of Council Climate Change plan progress

Total emissions for 23/24 were 27,634 tCO2e <sup>1</sup> a 40% reduction since 2015/16, this can be broken down as:		
Scope 1 emissions decreased by 29%	Scope 2 emissions decreased by nearly 57%	Scope 3 decreased by 6%


Our emissions reduced by 45% against the 15/16 baseline data for the Council Climate Change Plan<sup>2</sup>

tCO2e stands for tonnes of Carbon Dioxide equivalent. This is a standard unit to quantify greenhouse gas emissions.

<sup>1</sup> Includes the addition of district heating data since 2022/23. This data is not included in the 2015/16 baseline and the emissions inventory for the Council Climate Change Plan. This added an additional 2,172 (tCO2e) in 23/24, without this emissions would have been 25,463 tCO2e.<sup>2</sup>
