6. REPORT SUMMARY

RECORDED CRIMES PER 10,000 POPULATION

- We have less crimes per 10,000 population than the Scottish average for the following crime groups:
 - 1 (violence),
 - 4 (fire-raising, mal mis, reckless conduct),
 - 5 (drugs & other), and
 - 6 (miscellaneous)
- Group 2 (sexual offences) continue to prove the biggest challenge for us with the highest number of offences per 10,000 population at 5.0.

DETECTION RATES

- All of our Crime Group detection rates continue to be at the lower end of the scale compared to other Forces.
 - Compared to quarter 1 in 2010/11, our detection rates for groups 1 (violence), 2 (sexual offences), 3 (dishonesties), 4 (fireraising, malicious misconduct, reckless conduct) and 5 (drugs and other crimes) are all lower.
 - The following detection rates for Grampian Police are below the Scottish average:
 - group 2 (sexual offences),
 - group 5 (drugs and other crimes)
 - group 6 (miscellaneous) and
 - group 7 (road traffic) are below the Scottish averages.
 - We have the lowest detection rates in Scotland for group 5 (other), group 6 (miscellaneous) and group 7 (road traffic).

SUMMARY

Examples of excellent performance in quarter 1:

- Highest proportion of 999 calls answered within 10 seconds increased by 1.8% from quarter 1 last year to 98.9%.
- 2nd highest proportion of emergency response incidents responded to within Force target time. Increased by 1.9% from quarter 1 last year to 94.0%.
- 3rd fastest response time to emergency incidents. Reduction of 38 seconds from quarter 1 last year to 5 minutes, 31 seconds.
- 2nd highest number of Special Constables at 191, an increase of 18 from quarter 1 last year.
- 2nd highest number of hours spent on duty by Special Constables at 7753.
 This equates to 14.8% of the national total.
- 2nd highest percentage of reports submitted to PF within 28 days at 92.7%. This is a decrease of 2.7% compared to guarter 1 2010/11.
- 2nd lowest sickness absence figures for Police Officers and Police Staff at 3.7% and 2.8% respectively.
- 2nd lowest proportion of salary costs accounted for by overtime for Police Officers at 2.5% and joint lowest for Police Staff at 0.5%.

Examples of challenging performance in quarter 1:

- Highest proportion of sexual offences per 10,000 population at 5.0. Scottish average is 3.7.
- 2nd lowest percentage of reports submitted to Children's Reporter within 14 days at 71.0%, a reduction of 14.3% compared to quarter 1 last year.
- 2nd lowest proportion of ASBFPNs complied with at 51.2%, a reduction of 17.0% from quarter 1 last year.
