Couldn't get into my emails after we discussed this application by telephone. Now I find I do not have your direct email address so I hope this reaches you O.K.

Planning Application P120022 78 Malcolm Road, Peterculter

The members of Culter Community Council (CCC) discussed this application at ther meeting last week then the CCC Planning Sub-group discussed it further last night. The members were satisfied with the proposed dormer windows and with the use of slate matching those of the original roof. Had the finish on the single storey extension been dry dash with grey granite chips to blend with the granite of the building I would not be writing to you now.

However the proposed cedarwood finish brought out a whole spectrum of opinion fron the members ranging from 'larch and cedar finishes seem to be the coming fashion'; 'wood is considered a sustainable material as is stone'; 'if wood is to be used much more as exterior finishes, does, or will, the Council have some Policy/Guidance in its use especially with extensions to traditional granite buildings? In the end consensus was reached and the members agreed they would like to see a condition attached which allowed the fairly large extension to have a finish that was sympathetic to the original grey granite building. That is, matching

granite dry dash would be ideal but if it is to be cedarwood can it have a grey finish and not the usual yellow/red-brown colour.
