The Council has established a [Petitions Committee](#) to allow individuals, community groups and organisations to bring forward issues to the Council for consideration.

Members of the public can request to speak at a Committee in relation to a report on the agenda to ask the Committee to consider alternative action in relation to that report. This is known as making a deputation.

The Council and its Committees meet on an eight-weekly cycle. The public is welcome to attend most meetings, although some of the business may have to be conducted in private.

[I want to find out more about my local Community Council](#)

Community Councils are a way in which members of the public can get involved with local issues. There are currently 24 Community Councils established in Aberdeen. Find out more about Community Councils.
