However we have one guery which does not seem to be covered in the documentation we read: There is a large retaining wall currently running between the football ground and number 22,24 Loirston Road and number 1 Falkland Avenue. The land is at one point 2 meters below the garden levels. This wall has been put in place by the football ground when it was made and has been repaired/painted several times since then.

We noticed that no work has been mentioned of making good, or shoring up the wall to prevent any damage occurring? Just concerned the gardens could end up on the new road being made once the heavy machinery and ground works start. Apologies if we've missed this documentation.
