





N02 Percentage of adults supported at home who agree that they are supported to live as independently as possible





N03 Percentage of adults supported at home who agree that they had a say in how their help, care or support was provided.









N15 Proportion of last 6 months of life spent at home or in community setting.




Percentage of last six months of life spent at home or in a community setting.

N16 Falls rate per 1,000 population in over 65s.




N18 Percentage of adults with intensive needs receiving care at home.





N19 Number of days people spend in hospital when they are ready to be discharged, per 1,000 population










Percentage of last six months of life spent at home or in a community setting.






The number of bed days lost due to delayed discharges that have been recorded for people resident within the Local Authority area, per 1,000 population in the area




