REQUEST FOR THE REVOCATION OF A LATE HOURS CATERING LICENCE – 3-5 ROSE STREET, ABERDEEN

2. The Sub Committee had before it a request by the owners of 3-5 Rose Street, Aberdeen for the revocation of a late hours catering licence at these premises.

The property owner was represented by Mr Tony Dawson, J and G Collie LLP, Solicitors and Estate Agents, who was accompanied by the owner's daughter Ms Iridag.

The licence holder was not in attendance.

The Sub Committee heard from the owner's representative, Mr Tony Dawson, in support of the request. The Sub Committee asked questions of Mr Dawson.

The Sub Committee resolved:-

to revoke the current late hours catering licence for 3-5 Rose Street, Aberdeen on the grounds that the licence holder was no longer a fit and proper person to hold the licence.
