Public Performance Reporting

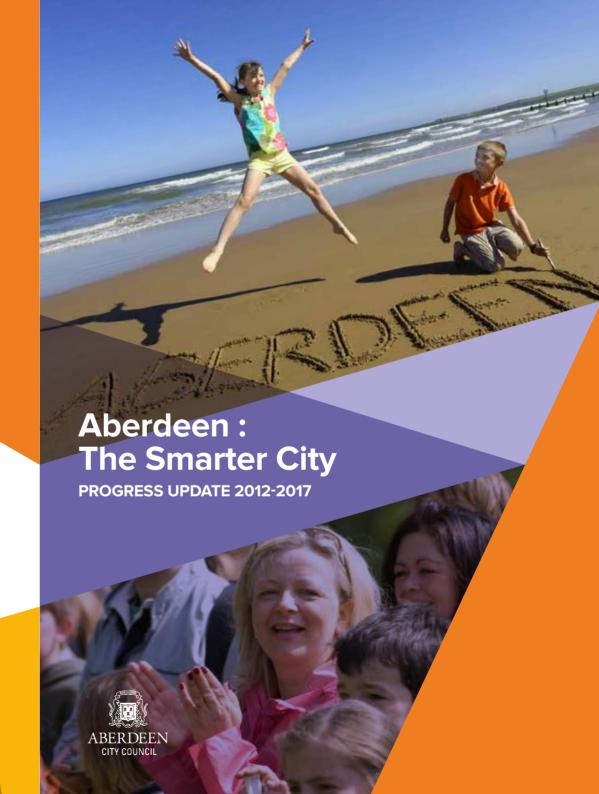
All Councils have a statutory duty to report publicly on their performance.

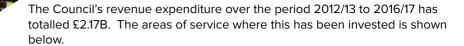
In 2012 Aberdeen City Council adopted a five year programme under the overarching theme of the Smarter City.

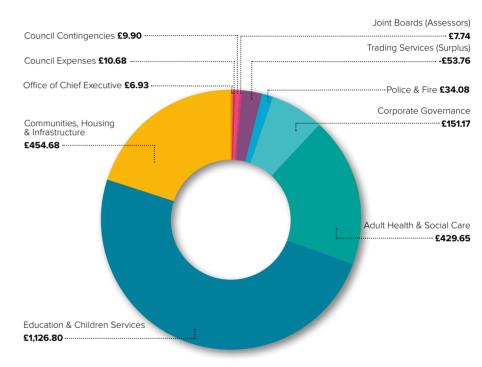

What we spent Council Tax on between 2012/13 and 2016/17 (£m)





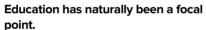

Since the Smarter Economy objectives were set there have been significant changes to the economic landscape. Throughout the downturn in the North Sea energy industry, caused by the low oil price globally, the importance of the Smarter Economy objectives has intensified.

Smarter Economy

Economic activity in the North East is high. Gross Value Added per head is £36,242, the second highest in the UK and 65% higher than the Scottish average. There are significant opportunities to sustain and grow activity in both the short and longer term.

The Regional Economic Strategy sets out a long term plan for the wellbeing of our place and people under internationalisation, investment, innovation and inclusive economic growth. The Strategy provided a framework from which to develop the Aberdeen City Region Deal. The Deal has an overarching funding package from 2016 over 10 years of £250 million from public and private sector partners.
