

Nationally, there were more people killed or seriously injured on built-up roads (roads with a speed limit of 40 mph or less) however, proportionately, casualties on non-built up roads were more severe.



These **provisional** statistics are provided by Transport Scotland and relate to reported injury road accidents (i.e. road accidents reported to the police in which one or more people were killed or injured) in Moray during 2016. Some national data has also been included.

The statistics are subject to a higher degree of revision from late returns and amendments than the overall national figures. In addition, there can be quite large percentage year-to-year fluctuations in the figures for local authority areas within Scotland, particularly for those with the lower numbers.

Final figures will be supplied in October 2017.
