**LICENSING (SCOTLAND) ACT 2005 - APPLICATION FOR THE GRANT OF A

I refer to the above application and in terms of Section 21(4)(a)(i) and (ii) of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005, I have to advise you that neither the applicant nor any connected person has been convicted of any relevant offence.

I am unable to confirm the existence of any foreign offence in respect of the applicant or any connected person.

Having contacted the applicant during the course of the application, he intimated that while dance facilities have been included as an activity in question five of the operating plan submitted with the application, there are no facilities within the premises to accommodate such an activity and he could not foresee any circumstance when this activity would be required.

It understood that 'off sales' will include sales made via the internet and therefore in terms of Section 22(1)(b)(ii) and (iii) of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005, I respectfully request that the Licensing Board consider whether a condition be imposed on the licence that requires the licence holder to ensure that the delivery of alcohol will be undertaken by a person who has received training to comply with the Licensing (Training of Staff) (Scotland) Regulations 2007.
