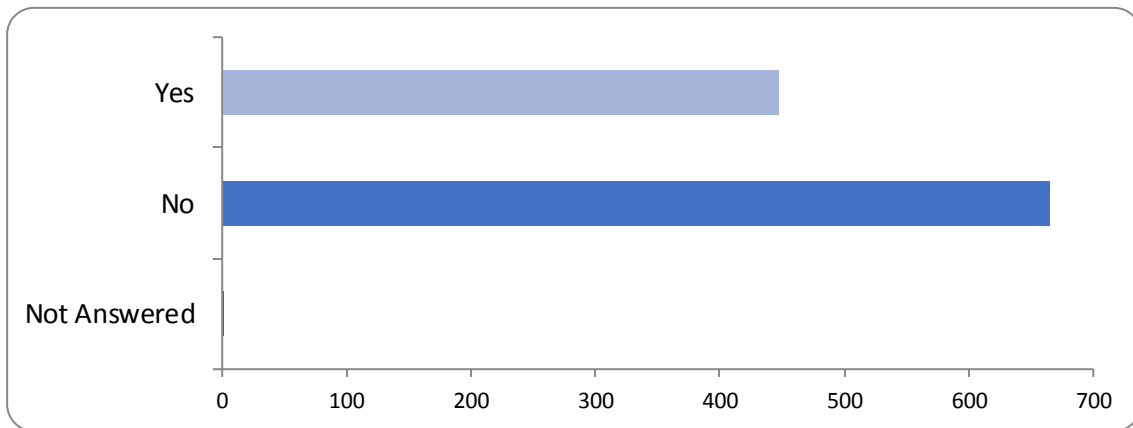


Do you agree with the abolition of the test for Private Hire Drivers?

Following that on, on the odd occasion that technology fails, the customer should be guaranteed a high level of competency from his/her driver. This can only be guaranteed if the said driver has undergone stringent training and passed an exam (with a high bar) to prove their competency. There's no other way.
