1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

- 1.1 This report presents the Annual Report on progress against the North, South and Central Locality Plans 2021/22. This is the first Annual Report since the Locality Plans were published in July 2021.

2. RECOMMENDATIONS

That Council: -

- 2.1 approve the Locality Plans Annual Report 2021/2022;
- 2.2 agree the for publication and circulation of the Locality Plans Annual Report 2021/2022 to all partners; and
- 2.3 note that an easy read version of the Annual Report would be produced.

3. CURRENT SITUATION

- 3.1 The [Locality Plans Annual Report](#) was presented at the Community Planning Aberdeen (CPA) Board on 23rd September 2022.
- 3.2 In December 2020, the CPA Board and the Integration Joint Board (IJB) agreed recommendations for joint locality working between Community Planning Aberdeen and Aberdeen Health and Social Care Partnership. This saw the bringing together of two models for locality planning which had been established in response to separate legislation – the Public Bodies (Joint Working) (Scotland) Act 2014 and the Community Empowerment (Scotland) Act 2015.
- 3.3 Locality Plans were co-produced with each Locality Empowerment Group (LEG) and Priority Neighbourhood Partnership (PNP) to identify priorities and community ideas. Throughout each locality plan, links have been made between community priorities and the work of the wider Community Planning Aberdeen Partnership being delivered through the city-wide Local Outcome

Improvement Plan. This has been done with the aim to promote collaboration on common priorities, supporting each other by sharing knowledge and experience and testing out ideas together to ensure they have the best chance of success, scalability and sustainable results.

- 3.4 In July 2021, shared Locality Plans were approved by the CPA Board and IJB for the North, South and Central Localities of the City. The plans incorporated improvement activity for the whole locality and/or targeted at specific neighbourhoods – in most cases priority neighbourhoods.
- 3.5 Delivery of Locality Planning is the responsibility of the LEGs and PNPs, supported jointly and equally by Public Health Co-ordinators and Locality Inclusion Managers.
- 3.6 The Annual Locality Plans Report 2021/22 is the first progress report against each of the shared Locality Plans. It provides an overview of progress made during 2021/22 towards the achievement of priorities within the North, South and Central Locality Plans.
- 3.7 One of the many challenges throughout COVID has been community engagement. There has been a noticeable decline, with a significant reduction in engagement within LEGs and PNPs. As restrictions have lifted, this is an ideal opportunity to improve communication and re-engage with our communities.
- 3.8 The Annual Report 2021/22 allows the LEGs and PNP to take stock of what has been achieved over the last year and to progress community ideas within each Locality Plan.
